Many schools have been cancelled, including in Tokyo where the capital's Kanto area is expected to be the worst affected. Hagibis was downgraded to a tropical depression late on Tuesday, although it still remained powerful, with gusts of up to 105mph recorded. The typhoon, which is moving north-west, came ashore at 12:00 GMT on Wednesday, but is expected to weaken in coming days and be downgraded to a tropical storm by Friday. Parts of northern Japan have been hit by heavy rain, causing a landslide at a tunnel in the city of Sapporo, just south of Hokkaido's capital, killing two people and leaving 14 others missing. According to CNN, more than 90,000 people remain without power in Japan, with officials telling media they expect the number to rise. All schools in the Kanto region were cancelled for the rest of the week on Thursday. The Yomiuri Shimbun, a Japanese newspaper, said that thousands of people stayed indoors

as more than 35,000 flights, mainly out of Kansai International Airport in Osaka, were cancelled for the rest of the week. Cities across the country were also expecting low-lying areas, including Nagoya, to be swamped. Officials at the Meteorological Agency said the typhoon was expected to bring winds of up to 135 kilometres per hour, with peak gusts of up to 210 km/h. In Tokyo's eastern suburbs, evacuees from homes that had been damaged by the typhoon were expected to begin returning to their homes on Wednesday, although a clean-up operation is expected to last for weeks.
